


Anything (MIT Press)



At a time when the fragmented ideas and styles in architecture make it seem as if anything goes, *Anything* asks whether there are constraints to thought and action that change anything to the thing. In thirty-two original essays, many of them illustrated, leading architects, theorists, historians and others discuss their works. The wide-ranging topics include a refugee republic, blur buildings, virtual environments, shopping, and stress. *Anything*, it would seem, is many things, opening the way for architecture to embrace history, science, research, and technology. Each volume is based on a conference at which architects and leaders in other fields came together to present papers and discuss a particular idea in architecture from a cross-cultural and multidisciplinary perspective. The conference upon which *Anything* is based took place in New York City in June 2000.
