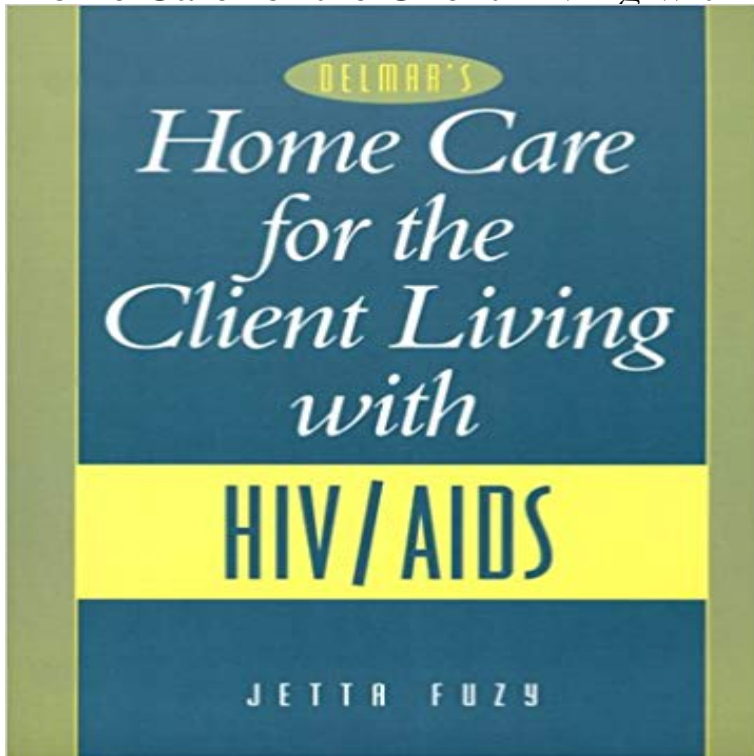


## Home Care for the Client Living with HIV/AIDS

The text focuses on the unique health care needs of this population, enabling readers to broaden their skill base. It includes an overview of HIV and AIDS, a general review of anatomy and physiology, transmission and prevention, and diagnosis and treatment. The specific roles and functions of the home care aide, especially observation, reporting, and recording information are stressed. Safety and emergency procedures and psycho-social influences are also addressed.
