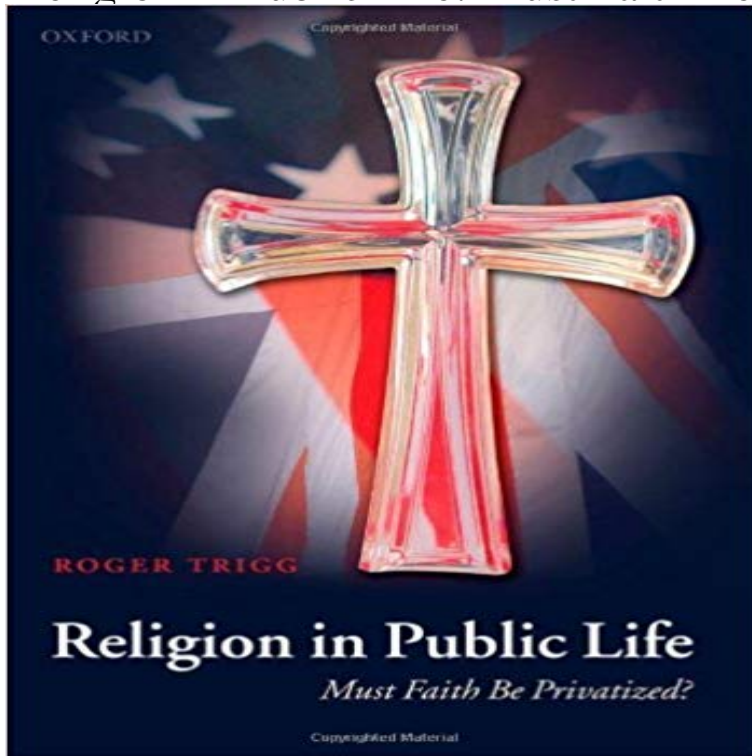


Religion in Public Life: Must Faith Be Privatized?
